Transport Fees (Letombo Park to Mandara)

As previously communicated, the school covered the transport costs for this term. From January 2026, parents requiring transport along this route will be expected to pay USD 20 per month per child (USD 60 per term), payable together with school fees.

Six learners sat for the DELF French Examination on 26 November at Alliance Française de Harare. The school awaits the results with optimism.

Parent Support & Appreciation

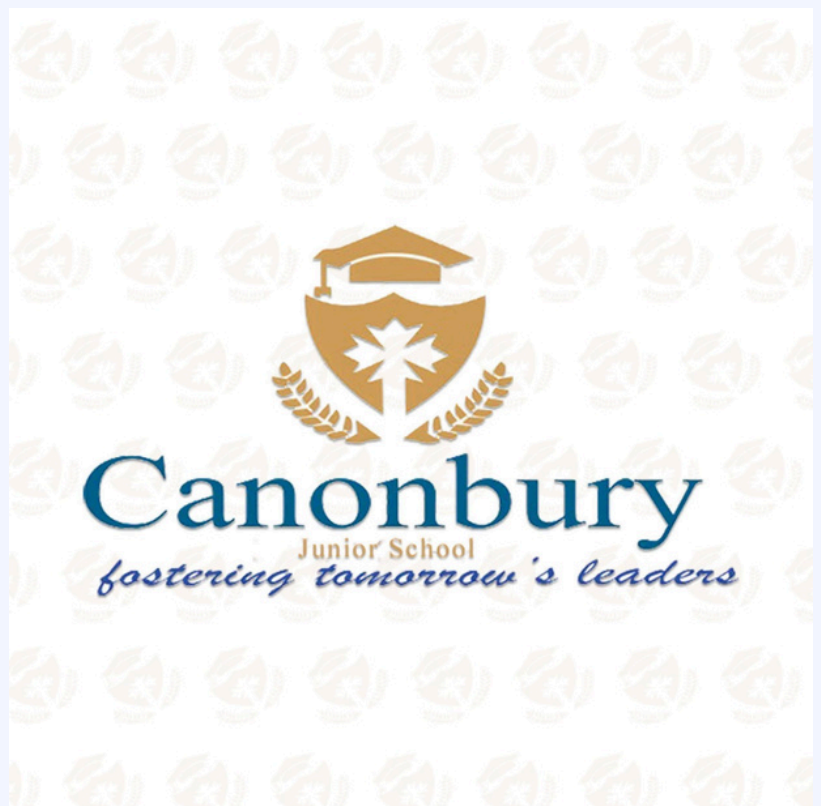
